Question 5: This Jane played the role of the sarcastic mom Lois on the sitcom Malcolm in the Middle, was married to actor Bradley Whitford, and even voiced a recurring character on the Simpsons. What is her last name?

Question 7: Name this infectious disease that features very painful rotting of the flesh and has caused more than 200 million deaths throughout history. Also known as the Black Death, it halved the population of Europe in the 1300s.
